A pleasant time was also afforded to those who desired a drive or a walk into the country. But when the shades of evening fell we had a repetition, if not weree, of the atmospheric conditions of Christmas night, as the wind howled and the rain fell in torrents till a late hour. The picture houses were largely patromsed. It was a quiet Christmas in the city, and, happily, devoid of unpleasant incidente.
