PERMANENT SUMMER TIME FOR BRITAIN,

Answering Sir H Brittain, in the House of Commons, Sir W Joycson Hicke said the Government would allow a free vote on the private member's Bill making summer time permanent, and would adopt the Bill, and carry through as a Government measure.
