The Dublin "Evening Mail" learns from well-ir formed source that the roal tax on Ford oars is about to be r duced by 50 p r cent. will reduce the tax on touring ours from £18 to £9 rearly, and on lordes from £16 to £8.

It is expected that the reduction will be retrospective as and from January 1st, 1925. In cases where the tax has been already paid on the higher spale, instead of refunding the d fference the authorities will extend the licence .

The reduction of the tax is due to a desire to encourage the Ford Industry in the Free State. It is estimated that upwards of 20,000 Ford cars are in use in the 26 counties.
