THE LATE MR W. MULLEN.

The funeral of the late Mr William Mullen took place this morning at ten o'clock from the Wesley Chapel, whither the remains had been removed last evening from his residence, 5 Crescent Avenue. A service was held in the Church previous to the funeral by the Rev C H Crookshank, who paid an impressive tribute to the excellent traits of character of the deceased, and at the close the hymn "Rock of Ages" was sung. The chief mourners were Mr W McCarthy, cousin, and Messrs B and L McCarthy. The cortège was very large and thoroughly representative of the commercial interests in the city, including Messrs Guinness, Son and Co, in which firm the late Mr Mullen had for many years filled the responsible position of cashier. It was, in short, a fitting tribute to his popularity and of sympathy with his sister and other relatives in their sorrow. The interment was at St Mary's Cathedral cemetery, where Rev Mr Crookshank offered up the closing prayers. The blinds were drawn in the business houses along the route, and also at the Shannon Rowing Club and P.Y.M.A. There were no flowers, by request.
