THE ENTERTAINMENT TAX.

The proprietor of the Abbey Kinema, Mr Ja- J Trehy, was prosecuted at the City Court last evening by the Inland Revenue Commissioners for contravening the provisions of the Finance Act relating to the tax on entertainment.

Mr H. O'B Moran, State Solicitor, prosecuted, and Mr J S Gaffney, solicitor, represented the defend- ant, who was summoned in respect of twelve persons admitted to a picture performance on the 6th November last, and who, according to the evidence, had not the halves of their tickets.

The defence was that there was a rush at the door, and the thing could not be avoided.

A fine of £12 10s was imposed in each of seven cases, two cases being dismissed, and three adjourned.

MEDICAL APPOINTMENT.

At the meeting of the County Board of Health to-day, there were three applications for the position of surgeon to the County Hospital, Croom—namely, Dr Ryan, Limerick City; Dr O'Connor, Tervoe; and Dr McEniry, Croom.

On the proposal of Mr O'Doherty it was decided to ask the Local Government Department to re- consider their decision, and to sanction the former appointment of Dr McEniry, and to allow him time to qualify in major surgical operations so as to come within the qualifications required by article 36 of the regulations.

RETURNED FOR TRIAL.

At the City Court last evening before Mr J M Flood, District Justice, Gerald Wallace was charged with the larceny of jewellery and wearables' value for £92, the property of Mr P Touhy, O'Connell Avenue.

The accused was returned for trial to the Circuit Court in balls of £50 and two sureties of £25 each.

A charge of stealing goods from the residence of Mr Touhy, preferred against Catherine Walsho and Margaret Healy, was adjourned for a week.

SUDDEN DEATH.

The death took place suddenly last evening, at 5 Davis-street, of an old man named John Mullane. The deceased had been under the care of Dr Graham for some time for heart trouble. In the circumstances, the Coroner, Mr J. S. McNeice, did not consider an inquest necessary.
