## LECTURE ON THE X-RAYS.

There was a large and appreciative audience at St Michael's Temperance Hall, Cecil street, on Tuesday night, when Dr Roche-Kelly delivered an instructive lecture on the X or Rontgen Rays on behalf of the Flower Stall of Tir-na-Og Fete, organised in aid of St John's Hospital.

Sir Vincent Nash presided, and in the course of his address Dr Roche-Kelly traced the history of the X-Rays, and by a series of lantern slides, manipulated by Mr James O'Brien, showed the application of the rays system to surgery in the human and animal anatomy.

The lecture was followed with close attention, and at the conclusion Dr Roche Kelly was accorded a hearty vote of thanks for his lecture by Mr W M Nolan, P.C., seconded by Mr M P Riordan.

## DEATH OF REV D BROSNAHAN, C.C.

The death took place in St John's Hospital yesterday morning, after a protracted illness, of the Rev Daniel Brosnahan, C.C., Banogue. The deceased clergyman was in his fifty-fifth year, and was a son of the late Mr J Brosnahan, Castle-Mungret. He was ordained thirty years ago, and ministered among other places at Donoughmore, and Banogue. He was an zealous and devoted priest, and his demise has been learned with deep regret by the diocesan clergy and a large number of lay friends. The interment will take place in Mount St Lawrence after Office and Requiem High Mass at 11 o'clock in St John's Cathedral to-morrow.
