**THE MULCAIR RIVER.**

In answer to a question in the Dail by Mr P K Hogan (Limerick), the Minister for Local Government said there was no liability on the Land Commission for the maintenance of the embankment on the River Mulcair. Subsequent to inquiry, intimation had been given tenants and their solicitors that the Commissioners propose to make application to the Judicial Commissioner to retain out of the purchase money a capital sum for the future upkeep of the embankments, and for the drainage maintenance rate.
