CYCLING ACCIDENT NEAR ADARE.

Farmer Killed.

Joseph Benson, aged 58, married, and an extensive farmer, was accidentially killed while cycling from Adere to his home at a place called Kilcookane last evening at five c'clook. The deceased was within a short, distance of his residence, and at a corner of the road he encountered the Croom Hospital motor ambulance, which, in trying to avoid him, toppled right over on bim, causing instantaneous death. The body was removed to a house close by, pending an inquest. The tragic occurrence was learned in Adare and district with extreme regret, as the deceased was highly popular, and was, up to some few years ago, a member of Croom District Council.

SHANNON BATHING FATALITY.

Farm Labourer Drowned.

A farm labourer named Joseph Bunce, aged twenty years, was accidentily drowned in the Shannon at Coonagh Point, Limerick, last night while bathing. The deceased, who worked in the locality, teing apparently unable to swim, went beyond his depth and disappeared before assistance could reach him, The body was subjequently recovered and taken to a house nearby, pending an inquest being held by the County Corpres.
