Registrar-General's Report,

The births and deaths recorded for the Dublin Registration Area and for the eleven principa provincial urban areas of Saorstat Eireann, with the annual rates per 1,000 of the population represented thereby, which, for the purposes of these returns, is estimated at 673,256, are given in Table I of the Registrar-General's report for week ending 6th instant. The births are represented by 230 in the Dublin Registration area; Cork, 231; Limerick, 609; Waterford, 20 9. In the period May 16-June 6, six cases of dipththeria were in all reported in the County Borough, and two cases of scarlet fever. were no other cases of infectious diseases in the lity area. The deaths from all causes apperaining to the undermentioned areas for last week and for the past four weeks, respectively, were equal to the following annual rates per ,000 of the population :- Twelve Town Disricts, 12 5 and 13 6; Dublin Registration Area, 3.7 and 14.1; Dublin Co Borough, 13.1 and 14.6; ork, 14'3 and 14'1; Limerick, 149 and 3'5; and Waterford, 3'8 and 8'1.
