IRISH WOMAN'S DEATH. Body Found in Field.

London, Monday—The body of Mrs Laura Alice Ryan, aged 25, who had been missing since July 5th from her home in Avon Road, West Christchurch, Hants, where she was living with her parents, was found this evening behind a covered bank in an untrfrequented field at Christchurch.

It is understood the body was bruised and partly concealed by ferns. She had evidently been dead for some days.

Man Detained.

A telegram received this evening says:—The Christchurch, Hants, police this morning detained a man in connection with the discovery of the body of Mrs Laura Alice Ryan in a field near the Christchurch Poor Law Institution on Monday night.

Michael Healy, aged 20, living in O d Franc's street, was accidentally knocked down by a motor car on the Ballysheedy road last evening. He sustained injuries to the head and body which necessitated his removal to the County Infirmary where he was detained.

DEATH OF SIR WILLIAM GOULDING.

We regret to record the death of Sir William Goulding, Bart, for many years Chairman of the Great Southern and Western Railway, and since amalgamation, Chairman of the newly organized Board. He was also a director of the National Bank, a steward of the Irish Turf Club, and a member of the Free State Senate. The sad event took place at his Dublin residence on Sunday night. He was the elder son of the late William Goulding, of Summerhill House and Ballyrusheen, Cork. Born on the 7th March, 1856, and receiving his early education in Cork, he graduated in Cambridge University as a Master of Arts. He married in 1881 Elna, daughter of Charles Lingard Stones, Pountney, Worcestershire, and had here one son and four daughters. The late Sir William Goulding's son, Captain William Lingard Amp'sall Goulding, A.D.C. (Irish Fusiliers, married in 1908 a daughter of the late Mr Justice Weights and grand-daughter of the late Sir Cocker Barrington, Glenstal Castle, Murroe.

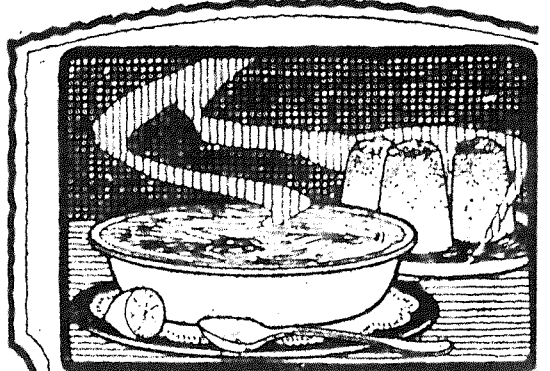
