Place, former Commissioner in Uganda, was so severely injured that he died yesterday morning. Iroy, assisted, and the fire b. rgades from New Ross and Waterford were summoned, but as thier appliance worll befiff ctive only where a high-pressure water supply was avalable their services were of no avail. Soon the roof of the house fell in. All the floors were burned through, and in a few hours only the blackened walls were I ft at inding.
