recognising the importance placed by the Govern-
ment on the construction of the railway connection
with the docks and quays and the Great Southern

FATAL ACCIDENT SEQUEL.

A man named Cross has been arrested in con-
nection with the death of a four year old boy
named James O'Loughlin in Barrington's Hospital
on the morning of the 26th December. O'Loughlin,
it was stated at the Coroner's enquiry, was
knocked down by a car in Upper Hery street
over a month ago and sustained injuries to the
left leg, which became septic. The jury found
that the occurrence was an accident.

OUTBREAK OF MEASLES.

Deaths in Kerry.

A Waterville Correspondent writes:—A severe
outbreak of measles is raging in the Waterville
district, and five deaths of adults have taken
place. In many cases the whole family are laid
up with the malady. The local doctors are
severely taxed dealing with the outbreak.

LORRY RUNS INTO WALL.

While driving into the City through Clere
street last night a lorry containing armed military
crashed into the guard wall of the Grand Canal
at Lock Quay. In the impact the occupants of
the vehicle were severely shaken, and a wide
breach was made in the wall. The lorry
fortunately came to a standstill, but the front
portion was badly damaged.

COUNTY LIMERICK CYCLIST'S DEATH

Collision With a Pony Trap.

While cycling from Hospital in the direction of
Herbertstown, on St. Stephen's Day, Edmond
Murphy, aged 22 years, a native of Kilballyowen,
Bruff, collided with a pony and trap, the property
of Edward Ryan, Kingswell, Tipperary, near the
river bridge, Hospital, where there is a bend in
the road.

Murphy was struck by the shaft of the car in
the body and badly injured. He was removed to
his own home, where he died on Monday night.

At the inquest which was held by the Coroner
(Mr P J Cleary, Kilmallock), the jury found that
death was due to peritonitis and collapse, the re-
sult of being accidentally struck by the shaft of
the trap. No blame was attached to anybody.

Ryan was brought before a Peace Commissioner
and remanded on bail.
