SHANNON POWER SCHEME.

Docks Trouble Over.

The trouble at the docks in connection with the handling of cargoes for the Shannon Power Sheme, which developed last week, was adjusted on Sunday, following a meeting of the dockers' section of the Transport Workers' Union, held at the Union Hall, O'Conneil-street. The dockers decided to discharge all cargoes from the steamers given to them, and to handle the material on the wharves unloaded from these vessels. They will not, however, touch the material discharged by the members of the National Ex-servicemen's Organisation, on the ground that this was a non-union labour body.

DEATH OF MR. JAS. GILLIGAN.

The death, which we announce with regret, took place at his residence, Islandroad, yesterday morning, of Mr James Gilligan, after an illness of some weeks' duration. The deceased, who was in his 65th year, was a well-known and respected citizen, and his demise has been learned with keen sorrow. Mr Gilligan was engaged in the pig-buying business, and for some years past was purchasing commissioner for Messrs. H. Denny & Sons. He was an old-time Nationalist, and took a prominent part on the Parnellite side in the 1892 and 1895 elections held in the city. He represented the Abbey and Castle division in the last Corporation, and in municipal affairs he brought into requisition the experience gained from a wide business knowledge, and by the fact of his being a member of the Borough Council in the period anterior to the Local Government Act, 1898. In private life he was the best of companions. always cheerful, and his anecdotes of men and things were ever refreshing and buoyant.
