OBSERVATIONS.—The above total rainfall is 9.60 inches less than 1924, which was one of the wettest on record. June was the driest month, with three rain days, one of which, 0.36 inches, fell on 5th, leaving 0.09 or one tenth between the two days. March was also a record dry month but showed very slight fall on fourteen days. February was the wettest of the year, with five rain days. The other months were all below average. The rainfall for the past ten years was as follows:—1914, 37.77; 1915, 33.50; 1916, 38.47; 1917, 34.86; 1918, 45.30; 1919, 28.20; 1920, 39.00; 1921, 23.03; 1922, 34.03; 1923, 41.93; 1924, 45.84
