SHOCKING CYCLING FATALITY.

Young Girl Killed.

A shocking accident, attended with fatal result, occurred on the road between Limetick, and Clonlara last evening, and in which Bridget (Brenda) Walshe lost her life. The deceased, who was nineteen years of ago; and a native of Ballyhahill, Foynes, was employed in the office of Messrs Siemens-Schuckert, shannon scheme contractors, at Sometime after six Clonlara, as typist. o'clock she was cycling to Parteen, Where she stayed with her aunt, Mrs. Kearney, and approaching a place called Connor's Cross, three miles from Limerick, she collided with Siemens-Schuckert's charabanc travelling in an opposite direction, and was killed almost instantaneously. It is stated that one of the wheels of the vehicle passed over the head, inflicting frightful injuries. She was only three weeks in the employment of the Shannon scheme contractors.

An inquest is being held this evening.
