MINING PROFITS AND MINING WAGES.

The aggregate profits made from the British mining industry have fallen from £16,900,000 in 1913 to £6,900,000 in 1925.

Large sums are paid in the way of royalties and way leaves, the amounts paid to royalty owners averaging about as much as the profits of last year.

Sums drawn from the industry include £370,000 by the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, £115,712 by the Marquis of Bute, £113,793 by the Duke of Hamilton, £83,827 by Lord Tredegar, £82,450 by the Duke of Northumberland, £64,370 by Lord Dunraven (in 1918), £40,522 by the Earl of Durham, and £43,497 by Lord Elsmere.

The average earnings per day of a miner in Scotland are 10s 4½d per day, and the terms of the owners would work out at an average wage of 6s 4½d per day. In North-umberland the owners' offer would mean an average daily wage of 6s 4d. In South Wales the proposed earnings would be 7s per day; in the Eastern areas 7s 5d; in Lancashire and Cheshire 5s 11d; and in Cumberland 5s 8d.

The average time spent below ground is seven hours and thirty-seven minutes, though nominally the miners have a seven hours day.
