LIMERICK DOCK WORKERS

Transfer to I.T. & G.W. Union

On Thursday night last Senator Thomas Hanly, General President, Irish Transport and General Workers' Union, addressed a very large meeting of dockers in the Town Hall. The meeting was called by the dockers' committee for the purpose of considering if the dockers would transfer to the I.T. & G.W. Union. The meeting was presided at length by Senator Foran, who explained the aims and objects of the Union, and stressed the point that if the workers were to have reasonable conditions in employment they must unite in one big union. After many suggestions had been made, it was unanimously decided to have a ballot on Sunday as to whether the dockers would transfer in a body to the Transport Union or not. The ballot was held in the dockers' rooms on Sunday, and the decision was an overwhelming majority in favour of transferring to the I.T. & G.W. Union. During the coming week these 300 dockers will be transferred to the I.T. & G.W.U. It is expected that in the near future other sections of workers in Limerick will also be transferred to the Transport Union.—COM.
