### RESCUE FROM DROWNING AT FOYNES.

Three young ladies, aged 20, 15, and 13 years, respectively, were bathing at Foynes on Sunday last when one of them got into difficulties and the others went to her assistance. All three were in a perilous position, when four young men from Limerick, and who were camping at Foynes Island, were attracted by their cries. They promptly arrived on the scene, and jumping out of their boat went to their aid and safely rescued them. The rescuers courteously declined to give their names to the Civic Guards, but it has been ascertained that one of them was a son of Mr O'Donnell, solr, Glentworth street, and the other a son of Mr Joseph O'Malley, B.E., of this city. They and the other rescuers deserve the highest credit for their plucky and courageous action.

### INCOME TAX ARREARS.

Mr John Quinn, Collector of Income Tax, proceeded some days since to distraint for arrears of tax with costs in six cases in the County Limerick. The tax was secured in three cases, while in two others the Civic Guard and bailiff were withdrawn consequent on a satisfactory arrangement being come to, and in the remaining case the collector was satisfied that altered circumstances justified delay. In one of two cases in Clare the tax was secured, and in the second it was found necessary to seize two horses which were impounded, but subsequently released on payment of the tax with costs. It is understood that other distraints are pending in Counties Limerick, and Clare.

### IRISH LABOUR CONGRESS.

The Irish Labour Party and Trade Union Congress, at Galway yesterday, passed a resolution admitting the organisation, affiliation and grouping of local Labour parties, with representation for them at the Congress, and the transfer of political funds from the Trades' and Workers' Council to the local Labour parties.
