

## SH PORK TRADE.

### Government to Develop.

Committee recently appointed to deal with the proposed development of the Irish pig-breeding industry met on Thursday at Ballsbridge Park, Dublin, C. M. Gibbons presiding, and to discuss and communicate with the Department of the Ministry of Industry and Commerce relative to the holding of a conference of all interests concerned with the industry.

The committee also decided to communicate with the L.M.S., and the G.S. Railways to discuss the charges and the facilities to be provided for the shipment of pork pigs from Ireland to the G.W. have already informed the committee that they are prepared to run special trains in connection with the industry. Home-Grown was considered as the most profitable arrangement for the export of carcasses.

The committee further decided to ask the Department to provide instructions for pig feeders regarding the feeding and management of pigs in connection with the trade.

## WOMAN TO SWIM THE CHANNEL.

### American Girl's Triumph.

English Channel has been conquered in record time. Miss Gertrude Ederle, 27-year-old American girl, who swam the Channel yesterday, was the first woman to accomplish the feat, and she established a new record by swimming the "course" in 14 hours. Her actual time was 13 hours and 39 minutes. The previous best time was that of the Italian, Sebastian Brichon, who was in the water for 16 hours and 45 minutes in August, 1923. Miss Ederle left Cape Grisnez at 7 o'clock on the morning of August 6, and landed on the beach between Kingsdown lifeboat house and Kingsdown Castle at 9.39 p.m.
