THE ABBEYFEALE TRAGEDY. LIMERICK EX-S- APPRECI

Inquest on Dead Woman.

An inquest was held in the County Hospital, Croom, on Thursday evening, by Dr. Clery, County Coroner, on Mary Donoghue, aged 57, who died in the institution on Wednesday, from injuries sustained by, as alleged, being attacked by her husband, James Donoghue, labourer, and who was remanded at Abbeyfeale District Court, on a charge of murder.

Inspector Kenny, Newcastle West, conducted the inquiry, and evidence of arrest having been given, Dr. O'Connor, Resident Medical Officer and House Surgeon, County Hospital, Croom, described the injuries. He stated that deceased had seven head wounds, three of which were compound fractures, three face wounds and two wounds on the hands. These would have been caused by an instrument such as a hatchet.

The jury found that Mary Donoghue died of abscess of the brain, as the result of a compound fractures of the skull caused by her husband on the 14th August.

It appears that about 25 years ago the parties came to Abbeyfeale from a remote part of the parish, and for some years the deceased owned a small business house, before going to reside in Convent street, where the husband followed the occupation of road surface man. On the morning of the unfortunate occurrence, the husband, who appears to have occupied a separate apartment, entered the wife's bedroom, and attacked her while asleep with a hatchet. Her head was fractured, and her nose, eye, and hand shockingly mutilated.

Some twelve or eighteen months ago the accused man made a deliberate attempt on his own life, being rescued by a neighbour at the time while hanging in an outhouse.
