DEATH OF MR. THOMAS GEARY.

The death, which we regret to announce, occurred at the Mater Private Nursing Home, Dublin, on Sunday, of Mr Thomas Geary, Merchants'-quay, Limerick. The deceased gentleman had not been in the best of health for some time past, but his demise was not expected, and consequently the shock to his family has been more keenly felt. Mr Geary was a well-known citizen and a capable and enterprising business man. He was head of the firm of Geary, Sons & Co., biscuit and confectionery manufacturers, whose business connections are extensive and have of recent years greatly developed. He took a deep interest in national affairs, and was a prominent supporter of the Sinn Fein movement.

The Harbour Board yesterday passed a vote of sympathy with the family of the deceased gentleman.

The remains arrived in Limerick from Dublin at nine o'clock last night, and were taken to St. Mary's Parochial Church, where Requiem Mass was celebrated this morning for the deceased. Subsequently the funeral, which was of large and representative proportions, took place to Mount St. Lawrence Cemetery for interment.
