To make provision for the reorganisation and regulation of the generation, transmission, distribution, and supply of electricity throughout the Saorstat, and, in particular, to make provision for the generation of electricity in the works constructed by the State under the Shannon Electricity Act, 1925, and for the transmission, distribution, and supply of such electricity, and, for that purpose, to make provision for the management, administration, and control of the works with a view to the efficient and economic operation thereof, and to amend the Shannon Electricity Act, 1925:
