

## LIMERICK HARBOUR BOARD.

### Dock Extension Scheme.

#### The Shannon Works.

Mr G. R. Ryan, C.E., presided at the meeting of the Limerick Harbour Board yesterday. There were also present—The Mayor (Mr P. A. O'Brien), Messrs D. Dwyer, F. J. Cleeve, M. Gough, B.C., J. Loughrey, J. McGuire, J. Dalton, E. Goodbody, P. N. Tracey, P. O'Flynn (Alderman), J. H. Roche, J. McNerney (Ald.), Senator J. P. Goodbody, M. Doyle. The officials in attendance were—Messrs F. Power, Secretary; T. F. O'Sullivan, Engineer, and Captain C. Hanrahan, Harbour Master.

Arising out of the minutes, the Mayor inquired if the Board had refused the application of Messrs Siemens Schuckert for space at the west end of the docks for the storage of transmission masts. If that were the case the Corporation were prepared to accommodate them in every way possible.

The Chairman—We did not refuse them. A letter was read from the Limerick Steamship Company asking for space at the west end of the docks, but the only available space at the west end was occupied by lumber cargoes. We then suggested to the applicants that they should approach the Corporation and ask them for some of the waste land behind the boundary paling on the south side of the Dock-road.

The Secretary read a further letter from the Limerick Steamship Company informing the Board that the space belonging to the Corporation would be unsuitable for the storage of consignments of transmission masts which Messrs. Siemens-Schuckert were exporting to Limerick for the purposes of the Shannon power works.

The Mayor said the Corporation were more than anxious to facilitate Messrs. Siemens-Schuckert, but the ground they owned was apparently unsuitable.

The Chairman—We have asked what space they would require, but they have not told us.

Alderman O'Flynn said the discussion only too clearly showed the necessity for the dock extension scheme, notwithstanding the criticism of that scheme.

The Chairman said the best course to adopt was to ascertain what space exactly Messrs Siemens Schuckert required, and for
