INTERNATIONAL HORSE-JUMPING COMPETITION.

Irish Officers do Well.

The gala performance of the International Horse Show at Olympia, London, took place yesterday, when the King and Queen were present to witness the jumping for the King's Gold Cup, for which military officers of seven European nations, including the Saorstát, had entered.

The Cup, which is valued at £500, was won last year by the U.S.A., which did not compete this year. The nations competing yesterday were France, Belgium, Italy, Poland, Sweden, Saorstát Éireann, and Great Britain.

This was the first occasion on which Irish officers took part in the competition, the Irish Army being represented by Captains G. O'Dwyer, C. B. Hartly, and D. Corry. The Cup was won by Lieut. X. Bizard, France, who was the only rider to jump the course without a fault.

The Irish representatives did well, but the conditions of jumping at Olympia did not suit them. Their display on the whole, however, was highly creditable, and they were warmly applauded.

All the officers competing for the Cup were presented to their Majesties before the competition began.
