The Budapest Correspondent of the
"Times" writing on August 3rd, says :—

This morning the British Military Attache,
Major Parry Jones, met with an accident,
in company with two Hungarian officers, in
a motor car in which he was travelling in
order to attend military manoeuvres near
Budapest.

In consequent of the unusual heat, the
chauffeur was overcome by a sudden giddiness
and lost his hold on the wheel, so that the
car ran into a tree and all its occupants were
thrown out. All four have been seriously
injured, especially the chauffeur, whose
condition is considered hopeless. Major
Parry Jones suffered a fracture of the skull
and other injuries. Luckily medical
assistance speedily arrived, and he was
taken to hospital, where, in the afternoon,
the physicians declared him to be out of
danger, and expressed their hope for his
complete recovery in about three weeks'
time.

The Regent, Admiral Horthy, and the

DEATH OF A LIMERICK PRIEST ABROAD.

A cablegram has been received in Limerick
from Wellington, New Zealand, conveying
the sad tidings that the Very Rev. Father
Maurice Fitzgibbon, P.P., of Levin, Wellin-
gton, son of the late Mr Maurice Fitzgibbon
and Mrs Fitzgibbon, of New Street, Limerick,
died on Monday last as the result of an acci-
dent, details of which have not yet to come
to hand. The rev. gentleman had spent
some ten years in that country, and he paid
a visit home last year, returning abroad in
November last. He has two brothers in the
Jesuit Order, Rev. Father Michael Fitz-
gibbon, of Mungret, and Father Dan
Fitzgibbon, of Clongowes. There is deep
sympathy in Limerick with the mother and
relatives of the deceased priest, who
was well and popularly known in the city,
previous to his going on the mission abroad.
