# COUNTY LIMERICK FARMER'S SUICIDE.

## Inquest and Verdict.

A determined case of suicide occurred Foynes, on Saturday Shanagolden, morning, the victim being an extensive local farmer named John Mullins, aged about 46 years. For some time past the deceased had been rather strange in his demeanour, and on Saturday morning he left the house at seven o'clock, summer time. Not returning a search was instituted for him, and a couple of hours later he was found by his son lying dead in the haybarn, with his throat cut, and a blood stained razor alongside him. Spiritual and medical aid was promptly requisitioned, and in time Father Higgins, C.C., a short Dr. Nolan arrived, but the unfortunate man was then beyond human The Civic Guard were also assistance. and had the quickly the scene, on Coroner for the district, Mr R. In the evening an inquest was held, and after evidence of identification and the demeanour of the deceased for some time past had been given, the jury returned a verdict of suicide whilst temporarily insane.
