

## THE GENERAL ELECTION TO DAIL EIREANN.

### Important Information for Electors.

The following has been issued by the Department of Local Government:—

#### WHO MAY VOTE.

The register of electors on which the Election will take place can be inspected at the local Post Offices, Garda Síochána Barracks, County Courthouses, etc. In towns the register is arranged according to streets, and in rural areas according to townlands in alphabetical order. The register contains a number of columns, but for the coming elections column "3," headed "Dail Franchise" need only be inspected. This column contains the letter "R" or the letters "BP" opposite the name of certain electors. This shows that such persons are entitled to vote at a Dail Election.

A person may have been registered in respect of (a) ordinary residence, or (b) business premises, or (c) university qualification, as on the 15th November, 1926.

Complaints that persons names are not on the register are, on investigation, often without foundation, e.g. a person may have removed to his present address since November last. Such a person should obviously look up the register for his "November" address.

Persons occupying business premises may find that they are not registered in respect of their "home" address. These people are probably registered in virtue of the "Business Premises" qualification. They should consult the register for the street in which their business premises are situate.

No person is entitled to be registered as a Dail Elector more than once. Therefore persons on the University registers will not be registered locally at all.

If by any chance a person is registered in two areas, he must remember that he is only entitled to vote once, and by voting twice he is liable to severe penalties.

#### WHERE TO VOTE.

The places where the poll is to be held will be set out on the posters to be published by the Returning Officer shortly before polling day. Where a number of polling booths are in the same building, electors will save themselves and the officials much trouble and inconvenience if they find out their numbers in the register (in column 1) and

## CHILD FATALLY SCALDED.

Mr J. S. McNeice, City Coroner, held an inquest at Barrington's Hospital, without a jury, into the circumstances connected with the death of May Lyons, aged two years, who succumbed to injuries received on Sunday last by falling into a pot of boiling water. The evidence of the mother, Josephine Lyons, of No. 4 North Strand, was that while she was preparing the dinner on Sunday the child fell into a pot of boiling water. She had her removed at once to hospital.

Dr. W. P. Dundon, house surgeon, Barrington's Hospital, stated that the child was extensively burned in the back and lower part of the body. She died this morning, death being due to shock caused by burns.

A verdict of accidental death due to shock and burns was recorded.

### Assailant Arrested.

Paris, Monday—An Italian fired a revolver at Count Nardini, the Italian Vice-Consul in Paris, at the Italian Consulate here this morning, wounding him.

Paris, Monday, 2.30 p.m.—Count Nardini, the Italian Vice-Consul, died on arrival at the hospital. The assassin has been arrested.

## COUNTY COUNCIL.

### Staff Re-organisation.

At the meeting of Limerick County Council on Saturday, Mr J. Bourke, chairman, presiding,

The minutes of the Staff Re-organisation Committee of the 20th ult. recommended that the Secretary be responsible for the supervision and execution of the whole office work, except that to be discharged by or under the supervision of the County Surveyors and their clerks. The Secretary shall require that an attendance diary shall be kept in the office for the indoor staff. The Secretary shall be personally responsible for the supervision of the work of the accountant and the preparation of the estimate for general rates and rates for separate charges, and shall, in addition, act as Secretary to the Old Age Pensions and Diseases of Animals Committees, and all committees appointed by the County Council, with the exception of the Board of Health, the Mental Hospital Committee, and Committee of Agriculture and Technical Instructions. That Mr Kelly be placed in charge of the general office, and that the accountant shall check and see that the rate books were properly and accurately made out in accordance with the estimates adopted by the County Council.
