The Life-boat Institution continues to carry on the work of life saving around the Irish Coast with the help of brave Irish fishermen, at the direct invitation of the Free State Government, who render every possible assistance through the Guards, and by telephonic communication, in promptly advising the Life-boat Coxswain when signals of distress are seen on the coast. The Institution has spent on life-boats, boat houses and slipways over £200,000, and every year over £8,000 is spent in Ireland on the 24 life-boats and their crews stationed round this coast. The record amount collected in Ireland was last year, when £4,500 was raised, but this left a sum of £3,500 to be sent from England. The speaker said he felt sure it was only necessary to place these facts before the generous Irish people for them to secure annually at least the amount spent in Ireland, and he felt sure any Irishman or woman would say that, if the Institution provides the boats without cost to Ireland, the people of Ireland should accept the responsibility of maintaining the boats in the highest state of efficiency. Over 500 lives have been saved by our Irish life-boats, many of them Irish fishermen, caught on the fishing grounds in sudden but heavy storms. Life-boatmen risk their lives to render service to absolute strangers in peril on the sea, and it is not too much to ask that the people (dependent on the export of produce and the import of so much of the food they eat), should do their part, and, without risking their lives, help by finding the necessary money to carry on the work in the highest state of efficiency.

A vote of thanks, proposed by Mr Solomon to Mr Corrigan for presiding, and the Chamber of Commerce for use of room, was unanimously passed.
