# ROADSIDE TRAGEDY SEQUEL

# Manslaughter Charge.

John Rowland Crossley, 126 Capel street, Dublin, was charged at a special court in Limerick last evening before Mr J. M. Flood, District Justice, with the manslaughter of Francis Fitzgerald, Queen St., Nenagh, at Lisnagry, Castleconnell, on the 20th October.

Inspector Munnelly prosecuted, and Mr J. S. Gaffney, solr., represented the accused, who stood out on ball.

In his evidence, Alphonsus Hassey. Nenagh, stated on the evening in question he was riding a motor cycle with combination car, in which the deceased was seated. He was returning from Limerick to Nenagh, and was travelling between fifteen and twenty miles an hour. Approaching Lisnagry he saw a motor van coming in the opposite direction on its wrong side of the road. When within thirty yards of the van witness endeavoured to cut across to avoid it, and in doing so was struck by the motor van. In the impact witness was thrown on to the grass on the side, and deceased was lying on the grass in an unconscious condition. The motor van lay on its side facing Nenagh. Immediately after the collision witness said he saw three men on the road, and looked to be intoxicated, one being bleeding.

In his evidence, Jeremiah O'Shea, Caherconlish, stated that when the motor van passed him it was swaying from side to side. After the accident he saw the van on its proper side of the road, and three men, who appeared to him to be intoxicated, come out of the van.

The case was adjourned for further evidence.
