## LARCENIES FROM MOTOR CARS AND BICYCLES.

### District Justice's Warning.

Mr Flood, District Justice, at the Children's Court to-day administered a serious warning in cases involving larcenies from motor cars and bicycles standing on the streets, and which have become frequent of late. He had been informed by the Civic Guard authorities that this class of offence was on the increase, and he was determined to put an effective end to it.

The Justice's remarks were the outcome of a charge against two boys named William O'Connell, Vize's Fields, and Joseph Dowling for the larceny of a handbag containing property to the extent of £8 from a bicycle outside a shop in Edward street during Christmas week.

O'Connell was committed to a reformatory for three years, and Dowling was given a suspensory sentence, on his parents giving bail for his future good behaviour.

## INCREASED PIG PRICES.

There was a further increase in the price of pigs to-day. On Tuesday top prices were quoted at 66s per cwt dead weight, and that figure has been now up to 68s, or an increase of 8s since Christmas week. The killings in the local bacon curing establishments this week likewise increased considerably compared with last week, when the returns were low owing to the holidays.

## DEATH OF CHRISTIAN BROTHER.

The death took place on Thursday night at the Community House, Sexton Street, Limerick, of the Rev Brother A. L. Nestor, at the advanced age of 88 years. The deceased Brother was well known in many cities in Ireland, and was during the past quarter of a century connected with St. Joseph's Orphanage. He was superior of the Brothers' schools in Fermoy, Wexford and Kilkenny, before coming to Limerick, and was a capable and zealous teacher.

## DEATH SENTENCE APPEAL DISMISSED.

Without calling upon counsel for the Crown, the Scottish Court of Appeal in Edinburgh to-day dismissed the appeal of James McKay, who in December, was sentenced to death for the charge of having murdered his motorman, Arbuckle, who was twice married, and whose dismembered body were found in the Clyde and in the woman's house.
