## SAD DROWNING ACCIDENT

### At Loughmore.

A very sad drowning accident took place at Loughmore, a few miles from Limerick, last Saturday afternoon, when a student of Mungret College lost his life. It appears that a number of the senior boys at the College, in charge of one of the Fathers, were returning from a walk, when some of them went to bathe near the Raheen end of the lake, where they had bathed a few days previously.

One of the boys, James Campbell, a native of Swinford, Co. Mayo, stepping into a hole, sank immediately. The boys nearest to him plunged instantly to the rescue, but failed to locate their fellow student. As the water was discoloured it was some time before the precise place where the accident occurred was located.

When the body was some minutes later recovered and brought ashore artificial respiration was resorted to under the direction of one of the Fathers, who has expert knowledge in this respect. Doctors McGrath and Corboy arrived at the scene of the accident very quickly, and did everything possible to restore animation, but without avail.

The deceased had been a student of Mungret for two years, was an only son, and was a great favourite with the community and his fellow students, who sincerely sympathise with his parents in their sad bereavement.

An inquest was held at Mungret College on Saturday night by Dr M. R. Clery, Coroner, East Limerick, and a verdict of accidental death by drowning returned.

The remains were removed to Swinford by motor on Sunday.
