LADY TO FLY ATLANTIC.

Melia Earhart Sails for America.

Melia Earhart, the first girl to fly the Atlantic; Mr Wilmer Stultz, the pilot; a London mechanic; Captain H. H. Arnold and Mr A. K. Mills have sailed for America on the United States Liner "The Roosevelt," the ship which sent their first radio message at sea, and will be remembered for the rescue of the British steamer "Antione" near Newfoundland. When Miss Earhart, or "Lady," as she is called at home came ashore followed by Messrs Stultz and Arnold in an outburst of cheers and clapping from the passengers and crew aboard the liner. Captain H. L. Manning greeted her at the gangplank. Medallions of the "Order of the Brave," similar to those given upon Captain Frier, Chief Officer and other members of the "President" crew at the time of the "Antione" were delivered to the fliers. "My wish is to come back quietly some time and really see England," said Miss Earhart as she gave a goodbye handshake.

THE SHANNON SCHEME.

Work in Waterford.

Waterford, Monday.—The southern circle of the Shannon scheme completed yesterday, when the river cable between Bilberry and Mount was erected. Very early yesterday German engineers with labouring were at work at each side of the river, and soon, despite the wind and rain, a line of cable stretched from the tall towers on each side. This cable connects the main line from the Shannon to Cork and will be independent of the Waterford line which will be provided by another cable. The six lines yet to be slung across the river to the transformer at Bilberry. The latter lines are erected and supply electricity will be available in the city soon, and this resource will be drawn
