IM LINER TO SEAPLANE.

Cork Harbour Scene.

When the Cunard liner Scythia arrived here yesterday two passengers left the ship in a whaleboat and boarded a seaplane which landed in the harbour. The plane, with its passengers, soon took off again and was soon lost to sight.

The passengers were Mr Wm B Leeds, an American millionaire, and his valet, and it was stated that they were flying to Bourg. The seaplane, which refuelled in Cork Harbour, arrived from Plymouth shortly before the liner resumed its journey to Liverpool.

Mr Leeds is the son of a Pittsburg millionaire, and was much in the public eye a few years ago on account of his marriage with Princess Xena of Greece. This is the occasion on which passengers from a plane were taken off by aeroplane at Cove.

A CITY TECHNICAL APPOINTMENT.

At the meeting of the Municipal Technical Instruction Committee last night, the Mayor (Mr M. Keyes) presiding, a letter was read from the Department of Education relative to the proposal to appoint Mr Mulcahy, B Com., Mungret street, City, Assistant Commercial Teacher in the Institute. As the position included giving instruction in shorthand and typewriting,

as Mr Mulcahy did not possess the qualifications required in these subjects, they were unable to give sanction to his appointment until such time as he obtained the requisite certificates on the higher scale.

The Committee pointed out that Mr Mulcahy's qualifications on the subjects were equal to those of the other eight applicants for the position, and having regard to his experience as a teacher, decided to send forward a representation to the Department asking that his appointment be sanctioned, with the proviso that he be given six months to obtain the necessary qualifications in the two subjects mentioned. The salary attached to the position is £20 a year, plus the cost of living bonus.

FARNANE LANDS.

On Sunday, at Murroe, a largely attended public meeting was held with a view to urging the Land Commission to acquire and divide Farnane lands amongst the uneconomic holders and labourers of the district.
