# PROPOSED NEW CITY MOTOR FIRE ENGINE.

A meeting of the sub-committee appointed to consider providing a new fire engine and escape for the city, was held on Tuesday night, the Mayor presiding. The meeting had under consideration the question of the most suitable type of engine to meet the requirements of the city, in view of the lower and higher levels prevailing, and the pressure of water which would be available, it being stated the supply could be only through the three inch mains forming the present means of supply.

It was decided that the necessary advertisements be issued by the City Surveyor for tenders, specifying full details and requirements, and embodying that demonstration trials should take place in Limerick.

# DEATH OF DR. A. V. SHINE.

We regret to announce the death of Dr A. V. Shine, which took place rather unexpectedly at his residence, Ballymacrease, on Tuesday evening. He belonged to an old county family; was 65 years of age, and second son of the late Mr Jeremiah Shine.
