DEFENDER OF VERDUN.

Famous General Dead.

The death in Paris of General Maurice Sarrail, former French High Commissioner for Syria, is announced in a Reuter telegram.

General Sarrail had a long career of very distinguished military service. He saw war in Algeria and Tunis, but his best work before the European conflict was cone as an organiser. At the beginning of the Great War he commanded the Third French Army, and was later appointed C.I.C. of the Allied Armies in the East.

He commanded the famous 6th Army Corps at the pivotal point on the Western Front, and his withdrawal to the Meuse was regarded as a masterpiece of fighting and manoeuvring.

At Verdun he held the fortress with three Army Corps and three divisions of Reserves and smashed up the attacks of seven German Army Corps.

When he was High Commissioner of Syria his relations with the Druses were not of the happiest, and he got into hot water over the bombardment of Danuscus.

DEATH OF REV. BROTHER M. BROPHY.
