the Government failed to secure a majority in the division, a political crisis would be at once created, and the Government would be faced with the alternatives of resignation or dissolution, as no Government can disregard a defeat on the Address. Conservatives are not, however, seeking any such consequences. They know there is a majority in the Commons against Safeguarding. It is not too much to suggest that if the Conservatives thought there was the slightest risk of a Government defeat on the Safeguarding amendment it would not be brought forward.

The Safeguarding amendment is to be pressed to a division in the knowledge that it cannot upset the Government. The state of parties in the House at present is:— Labour, 287; Conservatives, 260; Liberals, 59; Independents, 8; one seat, South-east Leeds, being vacant.

As both the Labour and Liberal parties at the election denounced the Safeguarding and other duties, which they regarded as protective, the Government has an ample margin of safety in the division. The amendment will probably be defeated by a majority of sixty or seventy.

CO. LIMERICK FATALITY.

At Bruff, Thomas O'Grady, a little child aged three years, came in contact with a bucket of water which had been recently boiling. Violent Thunderstorm in County Tipperary.
