SCHOOL TEACHER'S APPEAL

Against Conviction for Alleged Assault.

At Limerick Circuit Court to-day, Patrick Shine, principal teacher at Glenbrohame National School, appealed against the decision of the court below convicting and fining him £5 for assault on Patrick Hayes, aged 11, of Ballinamona, on the 21st January. It was alleged that the boy was severely beaten by the teacher in the school. This was denied for the defence, and it was stated he was beaten for telling lies.

The Judge held the boy was not excessively beaten, and that in the evidence given on his behalf there was a great deal of exaggeration. He reversed the decision of the court below.
