CURRAGH FATALITY.

Funeral of Mr J. H. Harty.

The remains of the late Mr J. H. Harty, Alston, Croom, one of the leading Irish professional jockeys, who received fatal injuries while riding Mr T. K. Laidlaw's Kirkurd in the Experts' Stakes at the Curragh, on Wednesday, reached Limerick at 1.30 yesterday by train from the Curragh, after Requiem Mass had been celebrated at the Garrison Chapel, Curragh Camp, by the Rev.
