DEATH OF DR WILLIAM FOX RUSSELL.

We regret to record the death of Dr Wm.
Fox Russell, M.B., a member of an old
County Limerick family, which took place
at Holyhead on the 13th instant in the 66th
year of his age. Deceased was a son of the
late Mr John Russell, of Glenview. He had
a brilliant medical career, and was M.O.H.
and Port Secretary M.O. at Holyhead,
where he was very highly respected
and esteemed. News of his demise
has been heard of with deep regret by
numerous friends in the County and City of
Limerick. He lost two sons in the war, one
being Dr John Fox Russell, V.C., who was
killed while attending the wounded under
heavy fire.

NEW BRIDGE LOAN.

The Board of Directors of the Munster
and Leinster Bank has, on the representation
made, agreed to extend the terms for re-
payment of a loan of £6,000 required by the
Corporation to fifteen years. The money
will be devoted to defraying the Council's
proportion of the cost of building the new
bridge over the Abbey river by the Ministry
of Industry and Commerce as part of the
Shannon Power Scheme bearing on naviga-
tion.
