IRISH NATIONAL WAR MEMORIAL.

Offer of Site by Government.

The Political Correspondent of the "Irish Times" says;—

"I learn that the Free State Government has offered to the Irish National War Memorial Committee a site for a public park to the memory of the 50,000 Irishmen who died in the Great War.

"The site is on Government lands at the Chapelized road, near Kilmainham, and is at present let out in allotments.

It is suggested that, if the Committee will accept the site, either free or at a shilling a year, the Government will undertake the care of the park for all time.

"Various proposals made by the Committee for the expenditure of the War Memorial Fund of approximately £50,000 on a suitable memorial have been rejected by the Government, and the offer now made is the result of a recent request by the Committee that the Government should make some suggestion which would be acceptable to all parties."
