CITY BURNING FATALITY.

Mr J. S. McNeice, City Coroner, held an inquest yesterday touching the death of Annie O'Donoghue, aged 74, of 5 Old Francis street, as a result of burns received on Saturday night.

Inspector Chambers conducted the inquiry.

Mrs Martha Kennedy stated she occupied a room in 5 Old Francis street. She knew the deceased, who lived in a flat overhead. About 8 o'clock on Saturday evening she heard a scream. She took no notice at first, but when she heard the scream she went upstairs to see what was wrong. She opened the door leading into Mrs O'Donoghue's flat, and observed the deceased's clothes and hair of the head lighting. She was standing up towards the room door, screaming for witness. Witness cried for help, and two neighbours arrived, who rolled a blanket around her and quenched the flames. The deceased's son went for the ambulance, but before the ambulance arrived Mrs O'Donoghue was taken in Mrs Butler's car to Barrington's Hospital. She was not able to speak to witness. The fire in the room was a slow one.

Guard Malone, John-street Barracks, deposed to seeing deceased at Barrington's Hospital at about 10 o'clock on Saturday night. The deceased stated that she was sitting at the fire and her apron caught fire. She said she was alone at the time.

Dr T. J. Morris, resident surgeon, Barrington's Hospital, deposed to the deceased being brought to the hospital on Saturday night in a collapsed condition. She had first and second degree burning on face, chest, slightly on the abdomen and right thigh. She died at 5.30 a.m. on Sunday. Death was due to shock following burns.

The Coroner returned a verdict to the effect that the deceased died from shock following burns accidentally received.
