**EMINENT IRISH RADIOLOGIST
 DEAD.**

A Native of County Limerick.
 Dr Maurice Hayes, who died at Monks-
 town, Co. Dublin, on Sunday morning last,
 was an eminent radiologist, and the author
 of many authoritative treatises on radiology.
 He was born in 1878, the son of Mr Thomas
 Hayes, Oola, and was educated at the
 Sacred Heart College, Mungret College,
 Limerick, and the Catholic University,
 Dublin. He held the Professorship of
 Materia Medica at U.C.D. and was late
 Physician-in-Charge of the Electrical Depart-
 ment, Mater Hospital, Dublin, and was
 examiner in Chemistry to the Royal College
 of Surgeons in Ireland. He was a man of
 a very charitable disposition, and highly
 popular. He served in the Great War with
 the rank of Captain in the R.A.M.C. In
 1922 his services were availed of by the Free
 State Government to organise the medical
 services in the Army, and, with the rank of
 Major-General, he was, in 1922-23, Director-
 General, Free State A.M.S.
