Report of Joint Committee.

The report of the Joint Committee of the

Limerick Harbour Tramways Bill states:—
“The Joint Committee report that they
have examined the preamble of the bill and
have amended same by striking out as being
unnecessary the provision for the borrowing
of a sum not exceeding £35,000 in respect of
the works authorised by the bill and insert-
ing a provision enabling the application to
the purposes of the bill of portion of the
moneys borrowed or to be borrowed for the
purposes of the Limerick Harbour Act,
1926; that the allegations contained in the
preamble, as amended, have been proved to
their satisfaction, that they have gone
through the bill and have made amendments
thereunto.”
