FATAL MOTOR ACCIDENT.

A motor accident attended with fatal result occurred above the Blackboy on Friday night. While Teresa Long, aged four years, was crossing the road to her house in Bengal Terrace she was struck by a passing motor car and gravely injured. She was removed to the County Infirmary, where she was attended by the resident surgeon, Dr Murnane, who found that the skull was fractured, and death took place on Saturday night. It is stated that the driver of the motor car was arrested and charged.

An inquest was opened in the County Infirmary last evening by Mr J. S. McNeice, City Coroner, and a jury, into the circumstances connected with the death.

Inspector Gaffney conducted the inquiry, and Mr E. Leahy, solicitor, appeared for the driver of the car, Mr Monahan.

Evidence of identification was given by the father of the child, and the medical testimony of Dr Murnane, Resident Physician, Co. Infirmary, showed that death was due to shock caused by fracture of the skull.

On the application of the Inspector the inquest was adjourned sine die pending criminal proceedings.
