

substantial free grants, amounting to 59 per cent. of the outlay. The scheme provides for the cleaning, deepening, and improving of the river from a short distance below the road bridge at Bruff to a point about 150 yards below Athlaca Bridge, and the cleaning of the river from this point down to the eel weir. The extent of the river to be cleaned is about 6 3-5th miles, and in addition about 8 3-8th miles of tributary drains will be dealt with, and also several accommodation bridges and passages. The total area of the lands calculated to benefit is about 2,100 acres, held by about 96 owners.

The majority of the owners are in favour of the scheme, and the inquiry is held to investigate the objections of those dissenting.

Considerable interest is centred in the inquiry, as it is the first one to be held for a new drainage scheme for the Co. Limerick under the Arterial Drainage Act, 1925. In past years this river has been constantly causing serious damage to the farmers adjoining by flooding, and the proposed scheme has been drawn up by the Commissioners of Public Works to put an end to any trouble in future.

The extensive drainage scheme recently carried out on the Awbeg River, which caused so much flooding in the districts about Charleville, Buttevant, and Mallow, has shown the excellent results that can be secured when drainage work is properly carried out, and similar results are expected from this scheme.

The carrying out of the work will provide employment for a considerable time for a large number of men, as all local labour will be employed, under direction of an engineer from the Office of Public Works.
