THE CALCUTTA SWEEP.

Prize Pool Totals £975,000.

Calcutta, Tuesday—Subscriptions to Cal-
cutta Turf Sweepstake bring the total pool
on which the prizes will be disbursed to
£975,000. There will be three first prizes,
three seconds and three thirds, and their
approximate values are:—1st, £125,000
each; 2nd, £62,750 each; 3rd prizes,
£31,250 each.

Tickets which draw horses, whether
starters or non-starters, will be worth £750
each.

At their meeting to-day the Turf Club
refused subscriptions totalling £38,000,
offered presumably by profiteering syndicates
in the Dominions, with the object of re-
selling the tickets at exorbitant prices.
Precautions are being taken to prevent the
winning numbers becoming known at the
draw on Saturday, but already seven syndi-
cates have been formed to buy out successful
ticket-holders.—“Daily News” Correspon-
dent.
