They were before a Peace Commissioner this morning at William-street Civic Guard Barracks, charged by Inspector Gaffney with intimidating Christopher O'Brien, a member of the employment of the Irish Labour Company. After formal evidence was given, O'Brien was remanded on bail to the City Jail for sessions on next Friday.
