## COUNTY LIMERICK MAN

### Murdered in New York.

A cablegram from Mr E. Clancy, of the "Irish Leader," New York, states that Mr John J. Hanley, better known as "Baron" Hanley, of Broadway, was murdered in New York yesterday. It is stated that having just left his bank, he was held up by six men, who occupied a limousine car. Having refused to respond to a "hands up" order, he attempted to draw his six-shooter, with the result that he was done to death. His assailants have not been apprehended.

Mr Hanley, who was born at Strand, Newcastle West, Co. Limerick, frequently visited Limerick on his Irish holiday, and the tragic news of his death was received with deep regret in the city to-day. He was a man of a very kindly and charitable disposition, and had a very successful career in America.

No news of the tragedy has been received at Newcastle West, near which Mr Hanley's sister and some nephews and nieces reside.

Inquiries in Dublin and Cork to-day failed to elicit that the news had been sent out by any of the official Press agencies.
