

# BRITISH AND SPANISH STEAMERS IN COLLISION.

## Vessels Speed Off to Assist.

A Lloyd's Gibraltar message says—The British steamer "Nerbudda" and the Spanish steamer "Legazpi" were in collision a hundred miles east of Gibraltar. Both are sinking. Steamers are going to assistance.

The owners of the "Nerbudda," London, state that she was a cargo vessel, homeward bound from Australia. There might be one or two passengers aboard.

## TRAGIC OCCURRENCE AT KILKEE.

While dressing for a dance at Kilkee last Sunday, a young woman named Miss Kennedy, of Bank Place, Ennis, got a haemorrhage, and expired almost immediately.

Her remains were removed to Ennis on Tuesday evening for interment in the family vault.

Chinese Communists have captured Changsha, the capital of Hunan. All foreigners were evacuated by British, United States, and Japanese gunboats.

Offences against the new Act, or Firearms Act, should be at once reported to the nearest Civic Guard Barracks. The Gardai are to enforce these Acts.
