Extracts from the "Limerick Standard" of February, 1830: February 24. COUNCIL BOARD.

Members of the Lunatic Board, this day, the Right Worshipful Mayor, in the chair, advertising the state of the County, and giving the averages for the City of Limerick for the year ending in the month of February, 1830, were fixed at £214, and the amount of the County for the period in the month of February, 1830, amounted to £470, thus making the total amount in our local taxes of the period of six months.
